WOOD ART DESIGN was established in 2002, originally under the name “Vejanovo Drevo”.

We ship and process exotic wood (especially teak, acacia, lychee, tamarind and mahogany).

We also ship, sell and distribute exclusive furniture and interior accessories made of these exotic woods.

Some pieces of furniture are being created in our premises in Slovakia, other pieces are partially or completely created in several exotic countries. All timber comes from Southeast Asia (mostly Thailand, Laos, Cambodia and Burma).

The luxurious furniture and accessories are all hand-made and thus every piece is unique.

You can either pick a piece from our catalog, or you might want to come up with your own idea about a unique furniture piece. We will assist you in the whole process, starting off by giving a dvice, shipping the material and eventually creating the furniture piece.





# HOW IT BEGINS, HOW IT ENDS ... AND WHAT IS IN BETWEEN

It all starts in Southeast Asia. Some trees from these areas that we use for our furniture manufacture can be even 800 years old and they differ from our trees mainly in the width of their tree trunks and the enormosity of their root systems.

Timber takes a long time to dry. The length depends on its width. For example, the timber that is 7 centimeters wide, takes about 7 years to dry. It is impossible to accelerate this process, as it could ruin the wood completely. This is the reason why the production is not an easy task. Already today we are drying timber that we are going to be using in five to six years.

After the drying stage comes the production stage. We manufacture our luxurious and stylish furniture. Most times we manufacture it based on your ideas.

It is only up to you whether you wish to influence the overall shape or just some particular details.

Irregularities of the table tops make them unique and original. Yet, you might prefer flat and smooth areas. In that case we offer to fill out the irregularities with epoxy resin. We can use it to fill out the table top to a certain shape. The process of adding the resin is our protected technology. We are very proud to be one of just a few to be able to use resin in this special way.

Next steps are milling, planing and grinding after which we apply a protective layer and that is either oil or lacquer (matte or high gloss). We use oil for pieces intended to be used in exteriors, those used in interiors are finished with lacquer. The final step is to create and add the table legs ... and now it is time for you to enjoy your new furniture piece!



# COFFEE TABLE IN THE BEAUTY SALON

Coffee table of original shape. It attracts attention not only due to its irregularity, but also due to a beautiful structure of the tamarind tree. The table has been shaped with epoxy resin in light brown color.





The table ideally complements the space it has been set into.  
The space itself does not have a regular ground plan which inspired  
the interior designer to bold color and shape variations.





# MASSIVE NATURAL DINING TABLE IN A FAMILY VILLA





More than a 4.5-meter long table from the acacia tree trunk represents a dominant piece in a sumptuous kitchen of a family villa furnished in a minimalist style.

The height of the table top is also impressive (11cm). This irregularly shaped table beautifully contrasts with direct lines of other interior parts. Ten people can dine at this table.





# COFFEE TABLE

## IN A FAMILY VILLA

Coffee table from the acacia tree trunk gives out a very pleasant feeling thank to its grains and hue. Two sides have been created by two parallel cuts, other two sides are featuring their original look including the bark. Its exclusivity is underlined by the high-gloss finish.





# MEETING TABLE

## IN A COMPANY MEETING ROOM

A furniture centerpiece of a meeting room of a private company. Made of the acacia tree trunk with visible irregularities (the table only has one straight side!)

Cleavages in the wood were smoothed by epoxy resin in grey-brown hue and its further sanding, repeated glossing and polishing. We hope that this kind of table provides grounds only for good and non-traditional decisions.





# WE (FROM FLESH, BONE AND IDEAS) WE CREATE FROM THESE MATERIALS

## ACACIA

Acacia is known for its gentle flame texture and olive brown or grey-brown hue with darker stripes. Durable, hard, flexible and solid. It is not easy to process, but is resistant to aging and biodegradation. Acacia wood is used in shipbuilding.



## LYCHEE

Tropical tree from Southeast Asia. The tree bark is grey-black, but the wood has rich brown-red color. The trees can grow up to 28 meters and their wood is typical for being dense and durable.





### MAHOGANY

The term “mahogany” refers to various types of dark hard wood. This kind of wood is often used in furniture manufacture. Red-brown mahogany wood is water-resistant and hard. In the past it was used in shipbuilding.



### TAMARIND

Tamarind comes from Africa, but it grows all over the world. Tamarind wood is hard, dark-red and durable. It is used in furniture manufacture, but you can also find it grown along the sea shores because it serves as a natural wind stopper.



### TEAK

Teak can be mostly found in Burma and Thailand. It is easy to process and is rich in natural oils that make it suitable for exposed areas.





# ECOLOGICAL IS LOGICAL



Yes, we do work with wood and we do need timber. But our wood does not come from protected areas. It is not logged just for the sake of logging with no control and it is not even logged because we have placed a certain order. We cooperate with local contractors and with local municipalities.

We buy timber from the areas where they need to clearcut vast land because of a building plan. Sometimes we get timber from trees that had to be cut for security reasons (for example in big cities where they could endanger passersby or traffic).

Timber trading in Asia is a strictly regulated field and the countries are keeping a very sharp eye on this trade. All timber that we ship from Asia comes from official sources.
